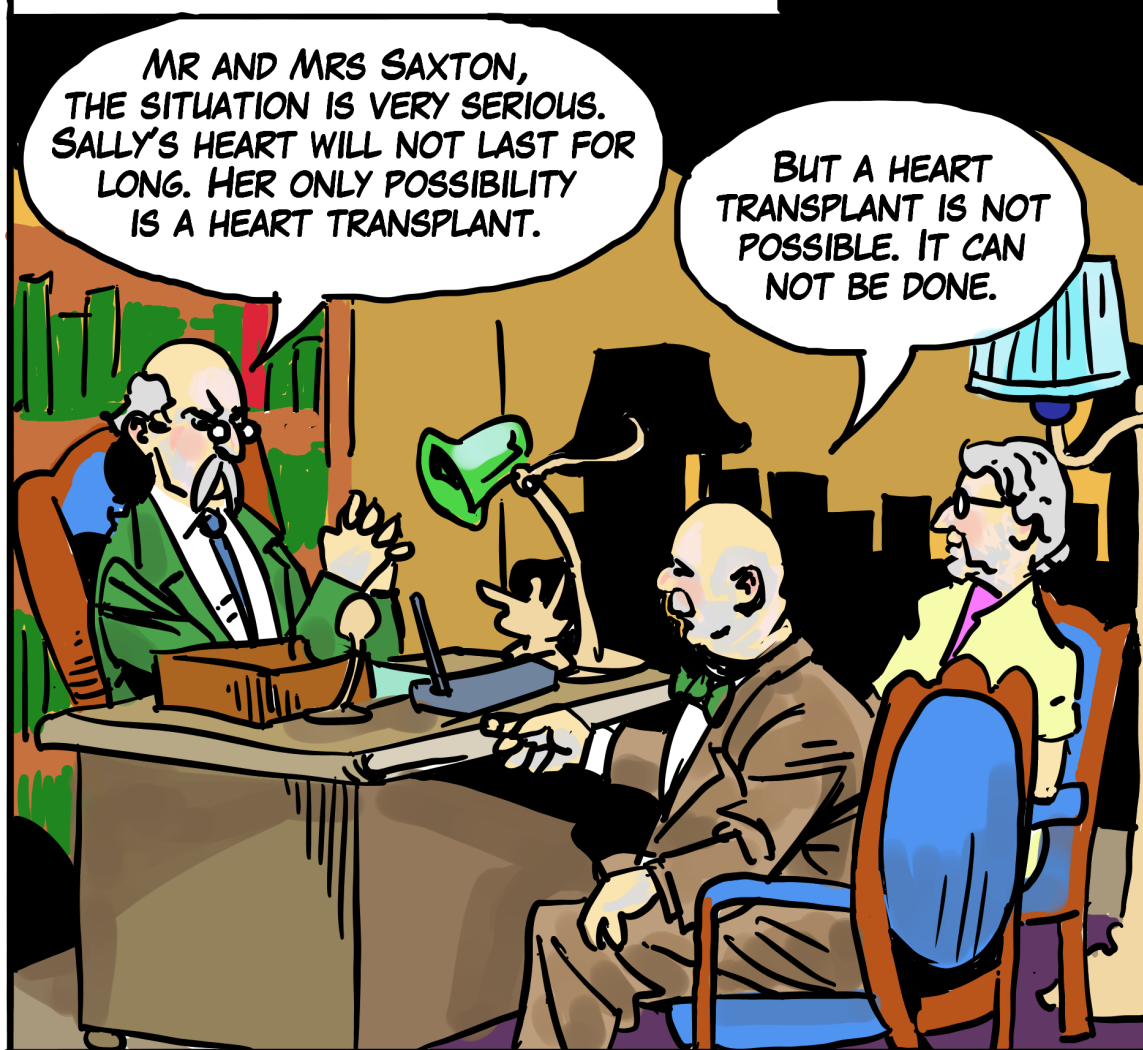

THE HEAD SURGEON, PROFESSOR STONE TALKS TO SALLY'S PARENTS IN HIS OFFICE.

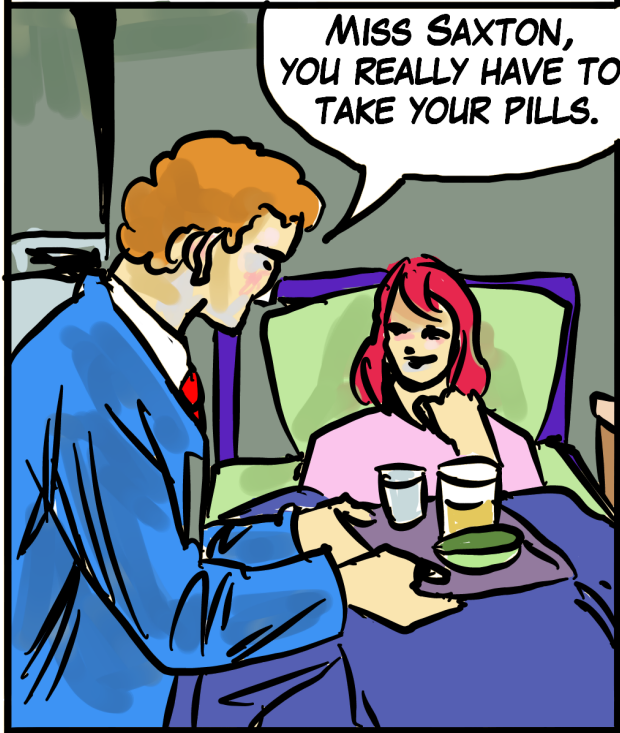
MR AND MRS SAXTON,

THE OPERATION TOOK 8 HOURS.

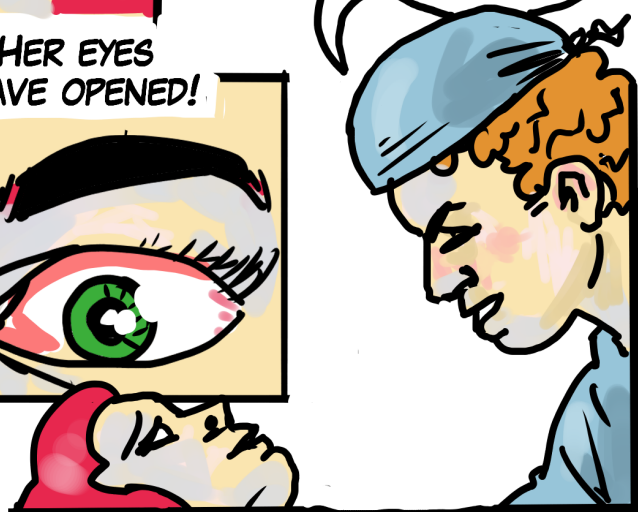


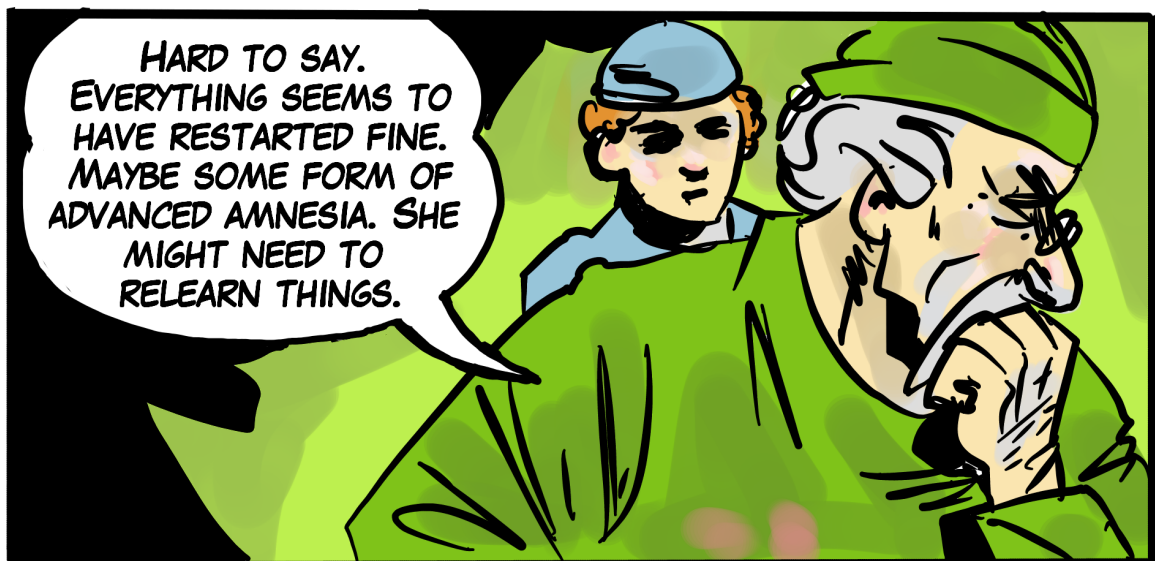
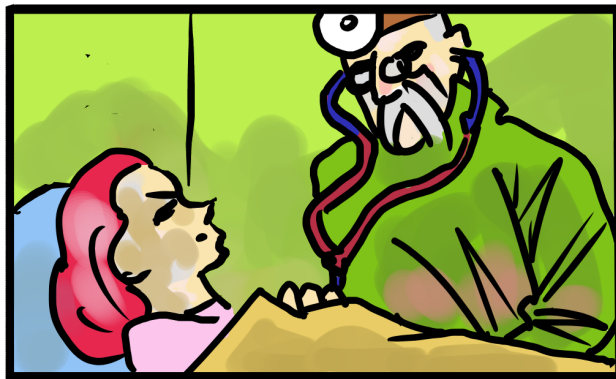

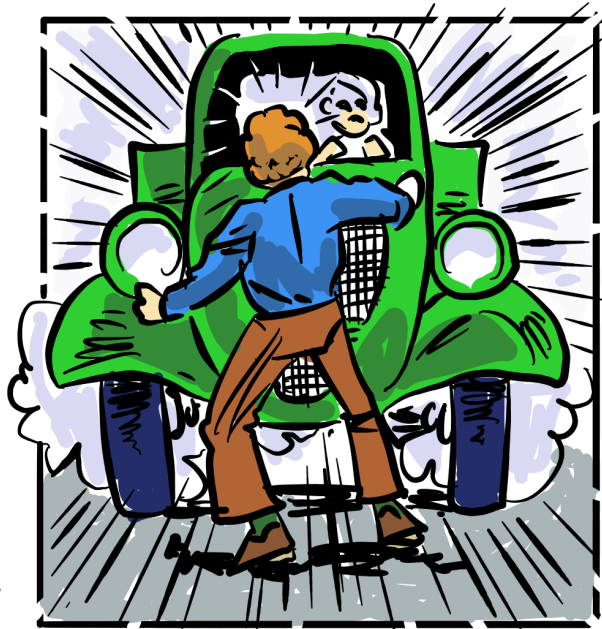
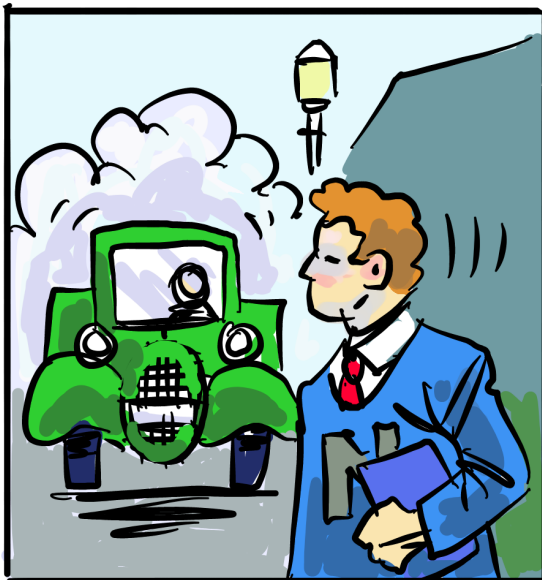
FOR MANY DAYS PAUL SITS WITH SALLY.

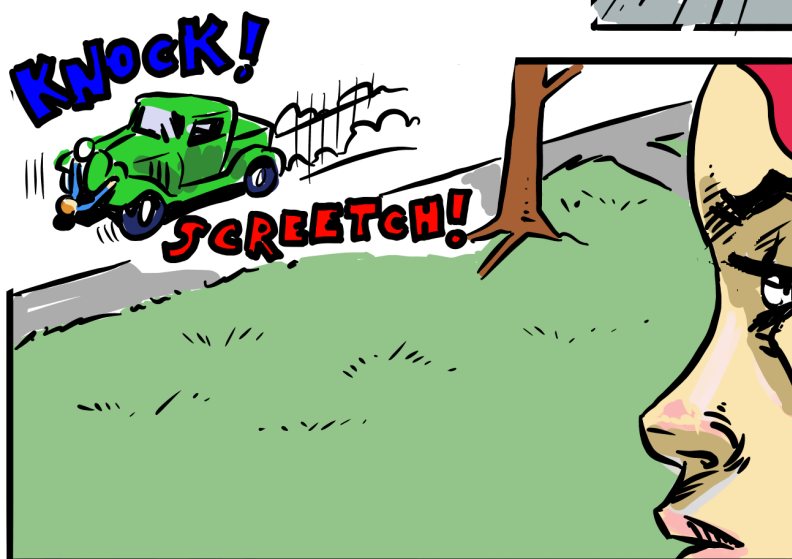
